

MAP & DESCRIPTION OF LAND TO BE ANNEXED FROM THE TOWN OF CASSVILLE TO THE VILLAGE OF CASSVILLE IN GRANT COUNTY, WISCONSIN.

Beginning on the east line of government lot 2 at its intersection with the S.W. rly line of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company's right of way, said point of beginning being south 00° 07' east 3382.4 feet from the north 1/4 corner of section 28; thence south 00° 07' east, 224.6 feet, more or less, along said east line, being also said right-of-way line, to a point on the ordinary high water line on the left bank of Jack Oak Slough, a part of the Mississippi River; thence upstream along the meanders of said ordinary high water line (approximately described as follows: N. 72° 06' west, 89.3 feet; N. 64° 40' West, 394.4 feet; north 69° 26' west, 276.2 feet; north 65° 31' west, 310.9 feet; north 63° 36' west, 388.7 feet; north 66° 23' west, 329.4 feet; north 62° 41' west, 294.8 feet; north 70° 36' west, 54.4 feet) a total distance of 2138.1 feet, more or less, to a point on aforesaid right-of-way line; thence along said right-of-way line as follows: north 24° 38' east, 215.1 feet, more or less, to a point; thence south 65° 22' east, 2041.8 feet to the point of beginning, said tract containing 10.6 acres, more or less, all of the same being located in sec. 28, T 3 N, R 5 W, Grant Co., Wis., being the same property acquired by the U.S. of A. from the Molo Sand and Gravel Company on Aug. 6 1940 by condemnation proceedings, Law Docket No. 3971 (Grant County, Wisconsin, Group 7).
